
SEND support plan review process

Parents invited to email in their comments via parents@ about their child's progress by **23rd Jan 2026** prior to Edukey 'closing' so that SSP targets can be reviewed. They can also be discussed during our spring parent consultations. Revised SSPs available from **27th February 2026** on Edukey.

Parents invited to email in their comments via parents@ about their child's progress by **6th October 2025** prior to Edukey 'closing' so that SSP targets can be reviewed. They can also be discussed during our autumn parent consultations. Revised SSPs available from **7th November 2025** on Edukey.

Parents invited to email in their comments via parents@ about their child's progress by **16th May 2025** prior to Edukey 'closing' so that SSP targets can be reviewed. Revised SSPs available from **6th June 2025** on Edukey.

Pupil Passports updated prior to transition - a document on Edukey that captures specific strategies or resources from the Ordinarily Available Provision but not targeted support.



Pupil Passports

Pupil Passports are a one-page profile of a child whose needs don't require targeted intensive support but there are specific elements of the ordinarily available provision (specific resources, strategies) that work well for them in particular. It can also be used for children stepping down from SEND support and are still monitored by the SENCO.
