Key Texts:

Queen Elizabeth II

Writing: To write a descriptive winter inspired poem. To use a modelled story as a starting point to create our own story. To write a fact file using questions to structure it,

Reading: To recognise and use previously learnt phonemes and alternative graphemes as well as new ones being taught. Continue identifying an increasing number of high frequency words.

Spoken Word: To develop their listening skills in order to respond appropriately to adults and their peers. To develop their ability to ask relevant questions.

Text and Word: To secure their knowledge in how sounds make words and to begin to use more sounds in their writing. To discover how words can combine to make a sentence.

Punctuation: To write in sentences using capital letters at the beginning and full stops at the end. We will also be using question marks at the end of a question.

Sentence structure: To compose simple sentences to communicate meaning. To use finger spaces in between words.

Learning Theme

What is a monarch and what do they do?

in **History** children will learn about the role of Queen Elizabeth II, why she was so special and what happened when she died. They will then learn about King Charles III. In **D&T** the children will be looking at the Golden Thread: Structures. They will explore the strength and stability of cardboard and learn joining techniques using minimal tape or glue. This will lead to planning and making their own Castle for King Charles III.
