Key Texts: Earth Magic, Sky Magic: Native American stories

Writing:

- Setting description of a North American country

Reading:

Great Works: Science Exhibition - torches

In **Geography**, the children will study about the continent North America. They will identify on the map where the different countries are and will be looking at a range of biomes and their characteristics as well as what makes a major city. The children will make comparisons between the UK and North America and understand about different time zones. In **Music**, the children will start learning a musical instrument with Surrey Music Hub to develop their musical skills. This term they will rotate their musical instruments. In DT, the children will use the science knowledge to design and make a torch with our trip to Sayers Croft in mind!
