CB reminded everyone that full accounts are available for perusal by anyone interested in reviewing.

Finance summary – events tend to raise around 20,000 per year and raised £25k over the past year. Spend requests tend to vary year on year based on the school needs. New acquisition is the new card payment machines – this makes it much easier to track sales, and reduces the amount of cash at events. It would be nicer to move across to less money at events which lowers our risk of theft or fraud. The interest of the saving accounts offset the cost of the machines while we have had a healthy bank balance. Question on how we pay for the card machines, the machines are pay as you go (pay per transaction rather than a monthly membership/cost + slightly lower transaction fee's). General feedback is that it makes Preloved and other sales much more straightforward.

An independent auditor is assessing our accounts/Call out for support on this point in the future.

## 6. NEW Spend Request (HP/JR)

### Playground Resurfacing – cost £35,500 (JR)

Thank you to those who turned up this evening and a massive thank you for the fundraising, when budgets are getting tighter the school has to prioritise any funds on staffing. Therefore, all the extra funds raised through the events and activities are very much appreciated by the staff and the children. What makes Ashley special is how everyone pulls together to deliver these experiences and creates a wonderful sense of community.

There has been a long-term plan to improve the overall outdoor spaces around the school grounds – space nearer the classroom, as well as the fields. They are so important to have good areas to play alongside learning.

At present Ashley has a very small playground for 630 children. The field is enormous but when the weather is wet the children are contained to a much smaller area. Therefore, the spend request is to pay for an extension of the current playground area (with a soft rubber surface) from the current end of playground up to where the hive building is located. This will give 300 sqm extra playground space.

This will also create a link between the school and the 1 mile a day walk path / hive area – and later the plan is to add some outdoor equipment such as a trim trail which will be fundraised by the school children.

There may be future calls on FOA fundraising. The school is in a period of consultation with the children on what play equipment they would like to see in that area.

### Questions & Answers with AGM attendees:

*Q: How does the school get money for maintenance or funding?*

A: (JR) The money the school gets goes to infrastructure for roofs and guttering. The school has gone out to charities and are always looking for collaborations or opportunities to provide experiences for the children at no cost – for instance the school gained a free wildlife garden via the RHS relationship.

*Q: Concern about timing and impact on children whilst work is being completed.*

A: (JR/HP) If the school get the go-ahead the new surface will be laid in the next half term – so when the children come back in November there will be this new space. Possibility of any overrun impacting on Fireworks, that it will squeeze the access to the way down to the field, but the plan for it to be done in time.

*Q: What are we giving up if we go ahead with the playground funding?*

A: (HP) If we approve - we will have £15-20K left in the bank account. This does mean that we may need to pause some smaller things like iPad replacements. We make 20-25k per year in fundraising and it is good to see that money being used. Concern about having funds available for deposits for future events were addressed – HP confirmed that it would not. In addition, in the planning for this year's Fireworks we have agreed with the main supplier to hold costs as of previous years and use a different ticketing system which has saved money. HP and CA have been renegotiating sponsorship as well to bring more financial support in for our events.

(JR) Play outside is of as much importance as iPads in the children's school day..

*Q: Question on maintenance and life of the playground beyond the 10-year guarantee?*

A: (JR) The surface will last at least 10 years, but the supplier has stated that they have never had to go back to a school to maintain – and other schools consulted have only laid their surfaces in recent years. It is maintained through sweeping, it should last.

*Q: What is the consequence of waiting?*

A: (JR) It is work that needs to be done, and the cost will just move to another year – it will cost more money in the future to do this work, as labour and materials are increasing.
